### Apply Now to be a Walker's Rising Star

The Walker's Rising Stars Scholarship Competition provides college scholarships to Pinellas County public high school juniors and seniors. Sponsored by noted neurosurgeon, Dr. Jeffrey Walker, scholarships up to \$10,000 will be awarded to solo performers in the areas of dance, drama, vocal music, instrumental music, and visual arts students. In addition, a new category has been created and a special honorary award of \$1,000 will be presented to the winning student team in the digital video category. The competition begins with an application and essay and will conclude with finalists being invited to display their works or perform at the Walker's Rising Stars Scholarship Gala in the spring.



Applications for performing arts students are due to the Pinellas Education Foundation office no later than November 7, 2008. ### Four High School Programs Named as County's First Centers of Excellence

A standing-room-only crowd attended the September 9, 2008 Pinellas County School Board Meeting to celebrate an historic moment for Pinellas County Schools, the business community and the Pinellas Education Foundation as the following programs were named Centers of Excellence for the 2008-2009 school year:

- Dunedin High School's Academy of Architectural Design and Building Technologies**
- East Lake High School's Academy of Engineering**
- Northeast High School's Academy of Finance**
- Pinellas Park High School's Academy of Criminal Justice**



Each of the four programs enables students to earn high school credit, college credit, and nationally recognized industry certification. Each has met demanding criteria to achieve this accomplishment, including creating strong post-secondary partnerships, establishing active advisory boards comprised of industry, corporate and post-secondary partners, and teaching curricula that leads to certifications in high skill, high wage, high demand jobs in Pinellas County.

"These programs offer rigorous, relevant and challenging academic courses that keep students interested, engaged, and enrolled in high school," said Gerry Hogan, Chairman and CEO of Canna Capital and Co-chair of the Career Education Fund Board. "My colleagues and I had the opportunity to meet some of the students and teachers in these programs, and we saw firsthand their high level of enthusiasm and active learning taking place."

Bob McIntyre, Chairman and CEO of DITEK and immediate past chairman, Pinellas Education Foundation, awarded representatives from each program with a Centers of Excellence flag for display outside the school. Hogan closed the flag

presentation ceremony by recognizing the strong support from the School Board, Superintendent and leadership of Pinellas County Schools for this critically needed career education initiative.
